What we've been up to recently ...

Early Years --- Creativity Week: Early Years focused their learning on Australia



Year 1— Creativity Week focus: United Kingdom

Wow, what a Creativity week. The children had a fantastic time getting messy and enjoyed the chance to show their creativeness.

We designed our own school uniforms in the style of Vivienne Westwood and made some fabulous self portraits using natural materials in the style of Andy Goldsworthy.

We also worked on a Year One canvas which is going to be displayed in the corridor at school, the large picture will show lots of different important places from around the World. Our canvas is representing The Angel Of The North and we think you will agree it looks fantastic.

We finished creativity week by sharing our work with Early Years and Year Two. It was lovely getting the chance to share what we had done with our friends and getting a chance to see what everyone else had done.



Year 2— Creativity Week focus: Spain

We have thoroughly enjoyed delving into Spain! We looked at the different areas of Spain, a little bit like the counties in the UK!

We have learnt about the Spanish artist Picasso, looking at four of his pieces and choosing which one we liked most and why. We then had a very active and creative afternoon, creating portraits in the cubism style through collage as well as on the Doodle Buddy computing app!

We discovered the wonder that is Gaudi! We absolutely loved exploring the magical creativity of the buildings he designed across Barcelona!

Gaudi is different to all the other artists we have discovered as he does not paint, he was an architect. His buildings are truly magnificent and include the Sagrada Familia (Barcelona's Cathedral which began in 1882 and is still under construction!) and Parc Guell, with its beautiful mosaics. He used many techniques in his work, including "trencadís ", a kind of mosaic made from broken pieces of tiles



Year 3— Creativity Week focus: Peru



We learnt where Peru is and about what life is like in modern day Peru. We then looked at the meaning of their national flag and we recreated it in card and made class bunting.

We looked at Peru's Aztec influences and their patterns and designs. We investigated the importance of llamas and created our own image using oil pastels, Brusho and pencil crayon. We completed a doodle chameleon with a Brusho backwash.

We learnt a bit more about the llamas of the Andes and Matchu Pitchu. We were interested to find out that their poo has no smell and they have 3 stomachs like a camel! We then, made our own 'No drama llamas.'

We learnt about the Ancient Civilisation that used to live in Peru – The Inca's. They would make masks for religious activities and ceremonies and they would always be colourful, include jewellery, feathers, tribal patterns and a head dress. We had a go at making our own. We even learnt how to make feathers out of paper.

We looked at the importance of textiles in Peru and how the textiles are made by hand. We used mixed media to decorate a display plate and recreated our own version of a traditional woven design in our sketchbooks.

Finally, we looked at Peruvian Worry Dolls. These worry dolls will help us sleep peacefully all night and take our little worry away. We had so much fun making our dolls using a lollypop stick, wool, paper and pompoms!





Year 4— Creativity Week focus: Japan

The focus for Year 4 was Japan and exploring its culture through its art and music. We researched Japan and made posters to share the information that we have learnt.

We used oil pastels to create another piece of work inspired by 'The Great Wave' by Hokusai. We also had a go at some origami making paper butterflies and attempting to make paper boats.

We created Japanese inspired pictures by dripping paint on to salt.

We created some beautiful pieces of artwork inspired by the cherry blossom in Japan. We used water colours to create the background and painted out cherry blossom branches on top.



Year 5 Creativity Week focus: India

We designed a traditional Indian outfit, made a Bengal tiger from clay, which we painted (we tried to make sure their stripes were unique), and sketched a National Emblem of India, which we then painted with water-colours. Some of our most talented artists collaborated to produce the amazing sketch of Sydney Opera House, which we painted with acrylics.

We collected lots of different natural greenery – such as leaves that had fallen off of trees, which we used, along with lentils, pasta and tissue paper to create some brilliant collages of the Indian flag!

We learnt about the Taj Mahal and its purpose as a tomb for the Emperor's favourite wife. We constructed models of the Taj Mahal white to look like white marble. We then tried to replicate the delicate decorations on the outside, some of which were made from precious stones and jewels. We made a huge amount of mess but had great fun!

We cooked Holi fudge, which is in many different colours, like the festival. We have taste tested our fudge and some traditional Indian snacks. This was so exciting we forgot to take photographs – ask your children for an update!

We even managed to find time to learn some traditional Indian dance moves and work in groups to create our own simple Indian dance.



Year 6 Creativity Week focus: Mexico

We looked at the Day of the Dead and made our own papier mâché calavera (skulls) after creating our skull designs in our sketch books; the mess was unbelievable!

We created some sun and moon artwork. The sun symbolises strength and power (and represented by warm colours), whereas the moon symbolises calmness, beauty and nurturing (represented by cool colours).

We explored ideas for a Mexican / Maya inspired mural which we created using a styrofoam printing technique. It was very difficult to get it to look like our designs and the children made several attempts but they showed great patience and resilience. They even improved their tidy up skills this week too!



Specialist Provision Creativity Week

We had a very busy week during Creative Week engaging with different activities to explore the country of Canada. We made marble painting flags, listened to Canadian music, explored maple-scented dough, coloured

in pictures, made and tasted Poutine (the national dish of Canada) and created a beaver toy (an emblem of Canada).



We also learnt about at the artist Georgia O'Keefe and were inspired to create our own floral artworks.

Dangerous Parking Outside Brookside Academy

We have recently had cause to address parking issues outside our Nursery entrance and car park. However, we often have reports of parents parking in strictly prohibited areas of Brooks Road: on the zig-zag lines, parallel to the crossing barrier, on the 'School Entrance' markings and causing an obstruction for our neighbours and the local bus service. This is an extremely dangerous practice and you will put yourself and others at risk.

The Highway Code states:

 'Yellow zig-zag lines outside schools, hospitals, or fire, police or ambulance stations indicate the length of road where stopping or waiting is strictly prohibited. The Highway Code states that you should keep these areas clear of stationary vehicles, even if picking up or setting down children.'



Keep entrance clear of stationary vehicles, even if picking up or setting down children

• Rule 238

..... You MUST NOT wait or park, or stop to set down and pick up passengers, on school entrance marking (see 'Road markings') when upright signs indicate a prohibition of stopping. Law RTRA sects 5 & 8

• Rule 243

DO NOT stop or park: near a school entrance.

We have witnessed the congestion this parking causes, with general traffic unable to proceed along Brooks Road past these vehicles. It also blocks the view for drivers entering and leaving our car parks and is dangerous to pedestrians crossing outside the Academy.

We understand that it is very busy along Brooks Road at peak drop-off and pick-up times and it is not always possible to park in the designated drop-off and pick-up zone outside the Academy.

Please allow a little extra time to find a safe and considerate place to park.

May we take this opportunity to thank those who already do this.

Attendance at school is vital to your child's learning and development.

Children's progress will be affected if they are absent.

We have a statutory obligation to investigate any child's attendance that falls below 90% or below the 10 ses-

sion absence threshold (10 or more half day absences within a 12-week period). Evidence of medical appointments, e.g. Doctor's/hospital/Dentist appointment cards/letters, etc., is required.

If your child is ill, please notify us before 8.45am via the **Studybugs** app, which is available to download from: **studybugs.com**.

Please inform the school beforehand if your child has to attend an appointment.

We are not able to authorise holidays in term time..

Children who arrive or leave school during the day **must** be signed in or out at the Academy office.

Free School Meals

Children who attend a Somerset County Council school, whose parents or carers receive any of the following are entitled to free school meals:

- Universal Credit with an annual household income of less than £7,400 after tax
- Income Support (IS)
- Employment and Support Allowance (Income related)
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance (IBJSA) not Contribution based
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit with an annual taxable income (as assessed by HMRC) of less than £16,190, as long as the family is not also in receipt of Working Tax Credit.

Only the benefits listed above qualify for free school meals. If you have recently become unemployed but are still receiving Working Tax Credits, you may be entitled to free school meals.

Non-Benefit related additional eligibility criteria:

Children of families who don't receive these benefits may also qualify for free school meals if the family's annual household income is no higher than the following:

- £22,700 for families outside of London with one child
- £26,300 for families outside of London with two or more children.

And the parent or carer meets any of the following criteria:

- you are a Zambrano or Chen carer
- families who have no recourse to public funds with a right to remain in the UK on grounds of private and family life under Article 8 of the European Convention on Human Rights
- families receiving support under Section 17 of the Children Act 1989 who are also subject to a no recourse to public funds restriction
- a subset of failed asylum seekers supported under Section 4 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- you hold a British National (Overseas) BN(O) passport
- you are a spousal visa, work visa or student visa holder
- you have no immigration status.

Children must be in school all day and they will be provided with a meal at lunchtime which is paid for by the school.

It is the responsibility of the parents or carers to register their entitlement and request free school meals for their children.

Children in nursery do not qualify for a free meal until they start school, but applications will be processed so that when your child starts school, you will already be notified whether they qualify for a free school meal or not.

Uniform Reminder

The school uniform is very simple and reasonably priced. We expect the children to wear it: White or red shirt/blouse or polo shirt, Brookside sweatshirt or cardigan (a plain, low-cost, red sweatshirt or cardigan is acceptable), grey or black skirt or trousers/shorts, red & white summer dress, black shoes. PE kit is red t-shirt and black shorts and warm joggers and trainers for the Winter. A warm, waterproof coat in wet/cold weather. Hair should be natural in colour and not of an extreme style (Mohicans, skinheads, or tramlines, are not acceptable). Every child should have a book bag and a PE bag. We give each new Early Years child a book bag before they start school. Sweatshirts, cardigans, PE kit and book bags can be ordered via the 'Uniform' link on the Academy Website. **ALL ITEMS SHOULD BE CLEARLY NAMED – PLEASE.** Parents/carers will receive a text reminder if their child isn't wearing the correct uniform.




